DAY 1 – DUBLIN TO CLARE

Sit back and relax...

It's a prompt start in the reception of Grand Canal Hotel Dublin at 8.20am.

Greet your guide, meet your fellow Driftwooders and board your super-comfy, slick Mercedes Benz/Volkswagen mini-coach for the adventure of a lifetime.

Then we aim for 'the city of the tribes' - Galway; it's atmospheric, it's historic and it's full of tasty food options for lunch.

Look out for traditional black-hulled Hooker sailing boats as we circumnavigate Galway Bay.

We'll have a perfect photo opportunity at coastal Dunguaire Castle, just outside the pretty village of Kinvara.

Next is the bewitching beauty of the Burren region, with its limestone lunar landscape, and uniquely rich flora.

Marvel at the Poul nabrone Dolmen, one of Ireland's great archaeological treasures. It's older than the pyramids!

Hold onto your hat! It's the world famous Cliffs of Moher. Stand in awe atop these magnificent 700ft high sea cliffs.

Revel in delicious food, cosy rooms and stunning coastal views at the Armada Hotel in Spanish Point.

The average driving time today is 4 hours 30 minutes.

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DAY 2 – CLARE TO KERRY

A castle fit for a kingdom

Gain a new perspective on Ireland's wild atlantic coastline, with a guided boat trip to historic Scattery Island (Tour Option - €15 per person). Exiting Kilrush harbour lock, we'll cruise across the Shannon estuary to take a tour of the island's deserted village, historic church ruins and stone round tower.

Another great option is to detour down scenic Loop Head. This narrow headland is besieged on both sides by the ocean. Watch as waves wash over dramatic geological formations at the Bridges of Ross. We should find time to stop into a traditional Irish pub as your Drifter passes through picturesque seaside villages along the way

Watch out for dolphins as we take a ferry across the mighty mouth of the Shannon - the longest river in Ireland or Britain.

We move onward, to Tralee. The largest town in Kerry is home of the Rose of Tralee festival and a beautiful rose garden.

Feel like royalty tonight in the old world elegance of Ballyseede Castle Hotel. Hear enchanting tales of times past at the bar, tuck into fantastic locally sourced food or unwind in the beautiful gardens.

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DAY 3 – RING OF KERRY

Islands, forts and shades of green

After a delectable breakfast at Ballyseede Castle Hotel, board the Drifter to join the world famous Ring of Kerry scenic route. Prepare to have your socks knocked off!

After a photo stop along scenic Dingle Bay, we'll visit an early medieval stone fort near Cahirciveen and then see the ancestral McCarthy clan stronghold, built in the 15th century.

Skellig Cruise: A 2 hour 30 minute cruise around Skellig Michael and its smaller neighbour, Little Skellig (Tour Option - €40 per person). Enjoy commentary on the islands' history, their amazing birdlife and fascinating geology. Departures are seasonal (mid-April to mid-October).

The ocean crossing is seasonal, lasts approximately 60 minutes each way and can be rough. Sea legs are definitely required. Your departure is weather dependent and occasionally subject to late cancellation.

We'll aim for lunch in the quaint fishing village of Portmagee.

Satisfy your inner culture vulture and your palette on stunning Valentia Island; taste ice cream only yards from where its grass-fed cows are milked, then visit the Skellig Experience to learn all about Ireland's unique island treasures (Tour Option - €5 per person).

This afternoon, visit Derrynane, historic home to one of Ireland's greatest figures, 'The Liberator' Daniel O'Connell (Tour Option - €5 per person). A ramble over nearby dunes reveals the golden sands of Derrynane beach.

We hit lively Kenmare in the early evening. Catch an authentic performance of traditional Irish music and outstanding local food in the town's many pubs and restaurants.

Your accommodation is at the centrally-located Coachmans Townhouse in Kenmare.

The average driving time today is 3 hours.

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DAY 4 – KERRY TO WEST CORK

Jaunts and jolly japes

Wander the winding streets of colourful Kenmare this morning, with free time to drift between cafés, art galleries and craft shops.

Pass over one of Ireland's most scenic roads at Moll's Gap; then be amazed by the bond between shepherd and dog, with a visit to a working sheep farm for a herding and shearing demo.

Gaze down over the beautiful lakes of Killarney at Ladies View, made famous when Queen Victoria's ladies-in-waiting stopped here in 1861.

A short hop on your bus and there's a scenic walk and photo stop at the multi-tiered Torc Waterfall.

Next we'll pay a visit to the stunning Killarney National Park. Take a horse drawn 'jaunting car' around this magnificent parkland (Tour Option - €15 per person).

You can also admire the charming 19th century Muckross House Gardens and explore nearby Muckross Abbey.

Accommodation and dinner tonight is at the family-owned Gougane Barra Hotel, or the Castle Hotel in Macroom.

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DAY 4 – WEST CORK

Time travel across Ireland's wild wonderland

Visit stately Bantry House, one of the few grand Irish homes still in private hands; owned by the same family since the 18th century.

Trace your roots and hear the story of the Irish famine at Skibbereen Heritage Centre (Tour Option - €6 per person).

Cast your imagination back through the mists of time at Drombeg stone circle; discover how Celtic gourmands cooked their dinner!

Peel back layers of history at riverside Timoleague Abbey; developed by the Franciscans on the site of an even older 6th century monastic settlement.

Seafood fans rejoice! It's back to the coast we go, to explore the picture perfect town of Kinsale. Enjoy a local menu of vibrant restaurants, atmospheric pubs and abundant craft shops in the gourmet capital of Ireland.

Your accommodation is at either the Blue Haven or Actons Hotel in Kinsale.

The average driving time today is 3 hours.

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DAY 6 – KINSALE

Unwind in Ireland's gourmet capital

Today is yours to design. Relax and soak up Kinsale's charms, with the option for some quality down time. Or bite into some deliciously cultural activities.

Taste authentic, locally-brewed craft beer on a tour of Black's Brewery (Tour Option - €12 per person).

Savour a tasting of real Irish whiskey in an authentic Irish pub - the 18th century Folk House Venue (Tour Option - €16 per person).

Relive bloody battles of the past with a self-guided tour of the dramatic star-shaped Charles Fort, located at the edge of the ocean near Kinsale (Tour Option - €5 per person).

Pay a visit to the Ringfinnan Garden of Remembrance in honour of the NYFD firefighters who lost their lives in the 9/11 attacks.

Whatever shenanigans you get up to in Kinsale, don't miss one of the many Irish traditional music sessions or a stroll around the town's winding streets and plentiful art galleries and craft shops.

Your accommodation is once again at either the Blue Haven Hotel or Actons Hotel Kinsale.

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DAY 7 – KINSALE TO DUBLIN

Time to say slán...

Before we say goodbye, there's still time for some of Ireland's top highlights.

Then it's time to kiss the famous Blarney Stone. Afterwards, explore the extensive grounds and lush, landscaped gardens of Blarney Castle.

Your guide will select a lunch stop along the route today.

A self-guided tour of monumental Cahir castle is a fitting way to end our odyssey. Gaze up in awe at the imposing walls, keep and tower of one of Ireland's largest medieval fortresses.

You'll disembark your Drifter back at the Grand Canal Hotel in Dublin between 5-6pm. Farewell hugs all round for your new friends.

The average driving time today is 4 hours 30 minutes.
